My amateur license came up for renewal recently, the ARRL sent an email reminding me to renew and providing some instructions. That's a good thing as much has changed since 10 years ago. The ARRL directions were good but not perfect.

An important note is that in addition to the older ULS Universal Licensing System, one also needs a CORES account, that is then linked to your existing callsign. In the process I needed to answer a ULS Personal-Security-Question (PSQ). So you need to keep different login, password, and PSQ information for **both ULS and CORES**.

ULS manages details about your call, while CORES manages payment of the fee and some other items.

1. Moonbounce

Program:

Mike will discuss moonbounce operation, traditionally uses CW and SSB, but is increasingly possible with newer digital modes. The path-loss is very high for moonbounce, so strong transmit signals, big antennas, and low-noise receivers are normally used. Scheduling of stations to work is common, since for some contacts the moon may be commonly visible by the two endpoints for only a short period of time.

2024 Amateur Radio Examinations

In the Rogue Valley, amateur radio exams are provided by the RVARC and the SOARC. New exam participants need to provide identification, while upgrading amateurs need to provide a copy of their current license as well as show photo identification. Applicants also need a Federal Registration Number (FRN) and email prior to taking the test. The exam fee for 2024 remains \$15.00. All license candidates must provide a picture ID.
